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Our Climate Justice Candle – The Journey Continues with the New ECI Candle!

The Eco-Congregation Ireland <u>Climate Justice Candle</u> has been weaving its ecumenical and climate justice journey around Ireland since the launch of the project in 2015. Our new candle has headed off on its ecumenical and climate justice journey again!

St Mary's Church of Ireland Cathedral in Limerick was the first church to host our new candle on Sunday 3 June. The visit of the candle also coincided with a special service in the Cathedral which saw the launch of a Community Awards Scheme. Among those present for the service was Deputy Mayor of Limerick, Marian Hurley; Senator Maria Byrne and Councillors from Limerick City & County Council. The preacher at the service was



the Bishop of Limerick, the Most Rev Dr Brendan Leahy, who highlighted and commended, during his sermon, the contribution of so many volunteers to the city of Limerick and its Citizens. Read more on the ECI website.

On 1 July the candle was present in <u>St Mary's Church of Ireland, Killarney</u> where parishioners used it in their Family Service. During this service they focussed on their young people's sunflower growing project and on nautical plastics.



On Sunday 22nd July the candle visited Kenmare & Dromod Union, Co Kerry. The Church of the Transfiguration, Sneem and St Patrick's, Kenmare hosted the Climate Justice Candle in special services as part of their progress towards the objectives of Eco-Congregation Ireland. The regular congregation was joined by visitors from the US, Germany, England, Greece and Limerick, illustrating the fact that we are one family under God, all with an equal share in the responsibility to nurture and protect His beautiful creation. Friends Burial Ground in South Belfast has gone beefriendly!

<u>South Belfast Quakers</u> have recently been exploring the idea of providing some space for a beekeeper to host their bees. They approached the committee in charge of the burial ground, located in south Belfast, who were very positive about the idea of having bees



in the space. The burial ground is a walled garden with lots of grass and trees. In June Karen, the beekeeper, set up her hive with a growing colony who have been thriving and expanding. She is getting assistance from Sylvia, a member of South Belfast Quaker Meeting. Karen hopes to be able to harvest some honey next summer. If there is enough, she hopes to donate some to the Quaker Care shop on the Lisburn Road to raise funds for Quaker Service - so eco-friendly and socially-inclusive too!

RCB and CITI receive their bee hives!

The Representative Body of the Church of Ireland has recently taken delivery of three hives of honey-bees to its offices in Rathmines, and the Church of Ireland Theological Institute has received four hives to situate on its grounds. Ms Fern Jolley, Property Officer, worked with the Dublin County Beekeepers' Association to choose suitable spots for the hives to be placed, so that the bee keeper can care for them during the year as they settle in to their new homes. The RCB has also signed up as a business member of the All-Ireland Pollinator Plan.



The RCB's actions are part of an on-going and growing movement across the Church of Ireland to protect the environment and its creatures – from graveyards in Myross, Co. Cork (<u>Eco approach to rural churchyard in West Cork</u>) to churchyards in Co. Wicklow (<u>Project to turn church yards into wildlife havens</u>). These projects and initiatives are part of the Church of Ireland's Environmental Charter, passed by the General Synod in 2015, which calls all members of the Church to the duty of environmental stewardship of God's creation, locally, nationally and internationally.

Update from Faith in Action Group, Ballineaspaig Parish, Dennehy's Cross, Cork

The Faith in Action Group in Ballineaspaig Parish has shared an update with us of their latest activities. On 'Seed Sunday' the group distributed free seeds of easy to grow vegetables, herbs and flowering plants after all the Masses. They hope as a follow up to this to invite parishioners to celebrate a special Harvest Thanksgiving Mass and Festival and to bring some of their home-grown produce to a Bring and Buy event on Sunday, 23rd September.



On the 7th June, Dr Tom Kelly led a walk for the group. Tom is a Zoologist based in University College Cork, who has a particular interest in birds. The group enjoyed learning to identify the birds from sight or from song. Faith in Action Ballineaspaig have joined the national 'Sustainable Energy Community' (SEC) Network as the first step in promoting energy efficiency and wider use of renewable energy and were delighted to receive a Letter of Offer from SEAI confirming approval for funding to develop their proposal to commission comprehensive Building Energy Ratings on a number of houses in the parish. ECI Endeavour Certificate presented to Daughters of Charity

On Thursday 28th June, Sr Catherine Brennan, Catholic representative on the Eco-Congregation Ireland committee, addressed the Daughters of Charity at their Provincial meeting in Dunardagh Blackrock. The Sisters have been working on aspects of Laudato Si in relation to awareness raising, reading and sharing on the encyclical and sharing on the small practical steps they have been engaged in. Just before their Provincial Meeting this year, Sr. Catherine was in contact to say that she would like to present the Daughters of Charity with an ECI Endeavour Certificate. This is another step in their journey to becoming a


what their one wish for change in Ireland would be in relation to sustainability. Friends were invited to send in short filmed pieces around three questions:

Reflection on a Bee Orchid by Fr Hugh O'Donnell

Fr Hugh O'Donnell is a poet and ministers with the Salesian community in the parish of Sean McDermott Street in Dublin. He completed the MA course in Religion and Ecology in 2004 at the Columban Ecological Centre at Dalgan. Out of that experience came his written reflection on the intimate relationship between worship and the earth, namely, <u>Eucharist and the Living Earth</u> (Columba), which was revised in 2012.
