How can I green my church?

Environmental measures can easily be incorporated into all aspects of church life:

Spiritual

- * Include a prayer for the environment in every Mass/church service
- * Make regular references to the need to care for God's Creation in sermons
- * Celebrate Creation Time from 1st September to 4th October every year

Practical

- * Reduce, reuse, recycle & compost
- * Use LED light bulbs & reduce thermostat
- * Use eco-friendly cleaning materials
- * Support and promote Fairtrade

Community

- * Connect with members of your local community by inviting them along to hear an environmental speaker or watch an eco-themed film. You could also organise litter picks, nature walks or tree/bulb-planting in your local area

Global

- * Support the work of a development agency working in countries where people are already impacted by climate change e.g. Trócaire, Christian Aid, Tearfund, Concern, A Rocha.
